This, coupled with intensive reading assignments on selected articles from <i>The Economist</i>, makes it possible for authentic language input needed for professional training</p>				

purposes. Students are required to write in various forms like summary, imitation, back translation, outline and etc. They are encouraged to participate in classroom discussion, presentations and debate for a further understanding of the topic. With all of these efforts both in class and after class, students are expected to reach a higher language and analytical level.
